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Teaching language	Italiano
Prerequisites	<p>To understand and use simple and familiar expressions to interact in some everyday situations (ordering at the bar, shopping).</p> <p>To introduce oneself and others by asking questions about personal details and answer similar questions about everyday life topics (work or study, leisure activities).</p>
Educational goals	<p>To understand frequently used expressions related to areas of immediate social relevance (e.g., basic personal and family information, shopping, work).</p> <p>To communicate in routine activities that require a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and usual topics.</p> <p>To describe and narrate in simple terms aspects of one's own experience and items related to immediate needs.</p>
Course content	<p>Main topics covered during the Course:</p> <p>Socio-cultural themes and lexical areas: greetings and pleasantries for welcome, leisure time of Italians, what to do and see in Milan, university life: places, actions and objects, universities in Italy, music and musical instruments, the house: rooms, furniture, objects and appliances, months and seasons, books and literary genres, Italians and reading, stores, clothing, brands of Made in Italy products, foods and festivals of Italians, health: wellness, travel, some tourist destinations, weather, sports, regions of Italy.</p> <p>Communicative Functions: Introducing yourself and introducing someone, talking about daily routine and leisure time, asking for information at university, making polite requests,</p>



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	<p>ordering at the bar, making arrangements, telling about something you did or something that happened, describing home, making an appointment, talking about childhood, describing physical appearance and personality, interacting in a store, describing clothing, talking about future plans, talking about health, giving tips for staying well, talking about travel and sports, telling about trips and vacations.</p> <p>Grammar: Review of the present tense of regular and irregular verbs, the impersonal form, the form of politeness, passato prossimo of regular and irregular verbs, direct and indirect pronouns, imperfetto, uses of passato prossimo and imperfetto, the informal and formal imperative, the comparatives, the future simple of regular and irregular verbs, the conditional of modal verbs, pronominal particles <i>ci</i> (locative) and <i>ne</i> (partitive). Prepositions of place and time, adverbs of time and conjunctions. Some discursive signs for dialogue.</p> <p>Phonetics and spelling: interrogative, affirmative and exclamatory intonation, some difficult sounds of Italian (tʃ cena, K casa, dʒ gelato, g gatto, ʃ sciare, sk scuola, f fiore, v viso, b bene, v vero, l figlio, l, filo, r mare, l male, n naso, n gnomo,), double consonants, expressive intonation (apologizing, expressing emotion, astonishment, embarrassment, asking for confirmation, commenting on an exclamation), sentence emphasis.</p>
<p>Teaching methods</p>	<p>Integration of principles of humanistic-affective, communicative action-oriented approach (task based); playful and collaborative activities (pair and small group work).</p>
<p>Assessment and Evaluation</p>	<p>The exam consists of 5 tests (4 written and 1 oral).</p> <p>The written part includes 4 tests: 1) Listening comprehension 2) Reading comprehension and vocabulary 3) Grammar on the topics covered in the course (see "Course Content" above) 4) Written production (writing a 150-word text from a choice of 3 different text genres including diary, narrative text, descriptive text, etc. and a dictation).</p>



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	<p>The oral part includes the 5) Oral Production test, which involves a conversation from a simplified text read during the course, a role-play and a reading aloud test (see "Study Materials" below).</p> <p>There will be 5 exam appointments: 2 in the winter session (between January and February), 2 in the summer session (between May and June), 1 in September.</p>
